



Hsipaw is a small hill station located in the Shan plateau, quite close to Mandalay. With the perfect mix of a laid-back town and an intriguing history, Hsipaw is a convenient hilly getaway in Myanmar. The lush green rolling hills fade away into the blue sky in the horizon. The town boasts different ethnic groups and unique markets that provide a definitive taste of local life to visitors.



### **BY TRAIN**

>> Daily train services are available from Mandalay to Lashio, which pass through Hsipaw. The route passes through the stunning Gokteik Viaduct.

### **BY BUS**

>> The daily buses from Lashio to Yangon stop at Hsipaw. Bus services are also available from Pyin Oo Lwin and Kalaw to Hsipaw.


#### **BY TAXI**

>> Private and shared taxi services are available from Mandalay and Pyin Oo Lwin to Hsipaw.

### **SHAN PALACE**

>> This beautiful palace is the residence of the Shan Dynasty. The nephew and his wife of the last king of the Shan Dynasty now live in this modest **Tudor-style palace.** 

#### **DOKHTAWADY RIVER**

The stunning Dokhtawady River is located near Hsipaw. You can hire a longboat and go up to the confluence of the river.

### SUNSET HILL/NINE BUDDHA HILL

Visit this hill for a mesmerising view of the hills around. The Thein Daung Pagoda is located here.

# HIKING THROUGH THE VALLEYS

>> Enjoy hiking through the lush green surrounding hills while you walk past hot springs and waterfalls. These hikes can be done without a guide.

### **BATHE IN HOT SPRINGS**

>> Hsipaw has natural hot springs frequented by locals and tourists.

Dress modestly while taking a bath.



>> With eateries that sell delicious and authentic delicacies, a food tour awaits you at Hsipaw. The mouth-watering Shan Noodles and Shan Tofu served in town are a must-try. You don't want to miss its unique salads, pickles and curries either.

>> Another must-eat delicacy is **Khaw Poke**, a kind of sticky rice that goes well with ground sesame and shredded coconut or sugar. Do try the homemade cakes and freshly brewed coffee served at the cafés here.

### HSIPAW CENTRAL MARKET

>> The main market in the town where locals sell fruits and vegetables. You can purchase local snacks of Myanmar such as a salted fish snacks.
