

- Ngapali beach offers many accommodation options ranging from backpacking guesthouses to luxury stays. The beach is divided into three main stretches that all face west, thus providing magnificent sunset views.
- >> The southern beach is located close to the airport and has hotels with good reviews.
- >> The north beach is about three miles from the airport, making it more convenient as the time for airport transfers can be greatly reduced. If you're travelling on a budget, there are affordable guesthouses available in the north beach area. However, it also offers one or two high-end hotels.
- >> Between these two lies the golf course and Linthar village, which has accommodation options too. The central beach offers several luxury stay options.



BOAT TOUR

Rent a private boat and snorkel off the coast of Ngapali beach.

>> Rent an e-bike and go up the hill.

SUNSET ON NGAPALI BEACH

- Since you'll be facing west, catch the spectacular sunsets!
- Also, try finding the famous low-hanging palm tree for perfect photo-op!

FOOD MILE!

- There is a whole stretch of food stalls run by families serving local street food.
- >> They are much cheaper than restaurants, and often right by the beach.

CHARMING COFFEE SHOPS

Some resorts have lovely coffee shops selling smooth and delectable coffee.

PEARL ISLAND

- >> A popular spot for divers and snorkelling enthusiasts alike.
- >> The waters are calm and locals are welcoming.

PARADISE BEACH

>> A spot where one can go **fishing** with the locals after a sunny morning of snorkelling in clear, blue water.

- >> It is possible to rent an e-bike which costs around **3,000 Kyats** per hour to get around easily.
- As an alternative to e-scooters, open-shared taxis might be a good option.
- If you're planning an uphill trip and don't want to ride a scooter, we recommend you to get a private driver instead.
